10. Meditate on 30:11-20. What wisdom can we gain from this section?
11. What does God reveal to Moses about the upcoming history of the Israelites? What is the difference between foreknowledge and predestination (This is your challenge question for the week and it will be discussed on the video)?

1. Notice who Jesus is staying with in 14:3. What does this tell about who Jesus spent time with? If Jesus came into the world today, where do you think we would find him carrying out his ministry?
2. Who is the Son of Man? What do you think this title means?
3. In 14:22-25 we see the words of institution for the Lord's Supper. What is our belief regarding this sacrament and how do these words back it up?
4. In 14:36 we see a lot of substance in the short prayer of Jesus. What meaning and application can we pull from these words for our lives?
5. In 14:51-52 we see a reference to a young man. Who might this man be (Hint: this event is only recorded in Mark)?
6. Why did the high priest tear his robes? What is blasphemy?
7. Why would they offer Jesus wine mixed with myrrh when he was on the cross?
8. What words does Jesus say in 15:34? Why would he say this and what does it tell us about the two-fold nature of Jesus (God and man)?
9. What proclamation does the centurion make in 15:39? What has Jesus shown even to the unbelievers who were there?
11. Some people believe that the Gospel of Mark should have ended at 16:8 since most of the prominent manuscripts ended at that point. Does that seem like a logical place for the Gospel to end? Does 16:9-20 contain any doctrine that seems contrary to the rest of Scripture?
12. After reading Luke 1:1-4, who and to whom did Luke write the Gospel?
13. Who is Zechariah and what happens to him?
