- 9. According to 7:5, who did not believe in Jesus? Does this change after his death and resurrection?
- 10. In the last part of chapter 7, why were the people divided about Jesus? It appears that people were either on one side or another. Is there any middle ground when it comes to believing in Jesus?
- 11. Notice who came to the defense of Jesus in verse 50. How do the others respond to him?
