13. What does 52:3 say about the price of salvation to us?
14. What do we learn about the significance of witnessing in the Old Testament from 52:7?
15. Read carefully 52:13-53:12. Who do these verses refer to? What do these verses say about this person's life and ministry? What prophecies were fulfilled? What does this section say about resurrection?
