- 7. The goat is a satanic symbol used in satan worship. Where do you think this imagery came from? What symbolism do you see in the sheep and goat judgement?
- 8. After reading 26:8-9 and John 12:4-6, who was the most upset about the woman pouring perfume on Jesus? What does this individual do right after this event?
- 9. What event has taken the place of the Passover in the New Testament Church?
- 10. What feelings are going through Jesus in 26:36-45?
- 11. Notice what Jesus called Judas even after he was betrayed in 26:50. What does this say about Jesus?
