Numbers 16-33

Key Verse: Numbers 30:2

If a man vows a vow to the Lord, or swears an oath to bind himself by a pledge, he shall not break his word. He shall do according to all that proceeds out of his mouth.

- 1. Why did Korah rebel against Moses? What became of those who rebelled and why? How did the people respond to this (16:41)?
- 2. What does the budding of Aaron's staff indicate?
- 3. What is the water of purification and what New Testament practice parallels this?
- 4. Why was Moses not allowed to be the one to lead the people into the promised land? What does this tell us about the seriousness of even one sin?
- 5. Who was Aaron's replacement after his death?
- 6. After reading 21:4-8, read John 3:14-15. What symbolism do we see between the bronze serpent and Jesus?
- 7. Who is Balaam and what did Balak, King of Moab, want Balaam to do to the Israelites? What did Balaam finally do and why?
- 8. What happened as a result of some of the people of Israel worshipping the false gods of Moab?
- 9. The second census took place nearly 38 year after the previous one. Are there any major population changes?
- 10. According to 26:52-55, how was the land to be divided?
- 11. What does 30:2 say about vows?
- 12. Why were Joshua and Caleb allowed to enter into the promised land (32:12)?
- 13. Why was Moses angry against his officers for not killing all the Midianites? Why were the Israelites supposed to wipe out their enemies as they did the Midianites (33:55)? Is there a symbolic message in all of this?
- 14. How is the plunder from the Midianites divided?

Key Verse: Mark 9:35

And he sat down and called the twelve. And he said to them, "If anyone would be first, he must be last of all and servant of all." t

- 1. What do we learn from 7:6-23?
- 2. Read Matthew 15:28 and Mark 7:29. Notice the words are slightly different for the same event. How would we explain this?
- 3. How do we explain 9:1, and when was this to be fulfilled? Just as in Matthew, what event fulfills this prophecy of Jesus.
- 4. Have you noticed that Peter, James and John are involved in more things than the other disciples? Why would Jesus do this and what can we learn from it?
- 5. Can 9:19 be a true statement of every generation? What are some characteristics that are similar to all generations?
- 6. How do we explain 9:23?
- 7. Read 9:38-41. What does this tell us as to how we should view other Christians?
- 8. Have you noticed that the outline for Mark is nearly same as Matthew. What are some similarities and differences you are seeing between the two accounts?
